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This week, I dusted off a book I read several years ago entitled Astroball. With ③ season in full swing it just seemed like a good tie in to the work we do at the **Intelligent Enterprise Leaders Alliance**.

<u>Houston Astros</u> fan or not, one has to admire the remarkable journey the organization has taken from perennial cellar dweller to one of baseball's most successful franchises over the last decade.

At the <u>IELA</u>, we're always seeking new ways to understand how <u>data</u>, leadership, and cultural transformation come together to create outsized impact. Astroball, by <u>Ben Reiter</u>, is a fascinating look at how a baseball team used a radically different approach to analytics to go from laughingstock to World Series champions.

But this isn't really a book about baseball. It's a book about transformation, culture, trust and the convergence of data and human judgment.

## Why It Matters to Enterprise Leaders

The Astros didn't just collect more data—they built a system that allowed the team to trust the data. They didn't eliminate human intuition—they taught scouts and analysts to work together, layering subjective insight with predictive models. They moved from gut-based decisions to precision analytics—without losing the soul of the game.

## Sound familiar?

The most intelligent enterprises today face similar challenges:

- ♦ How do we balance data and instinct in decision-making?
- Now do we build analytics capabilities without alienating domain experts?
- ♦ How do we operationalize insights to win—not just measure performance?

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The Astros built a proprietary analytics engine capable of modeling not just performance, but potential. They used it to spot undervalued talent, guide trades, shape draft strategy, and even influence in-game decisions.
